

## 2010 Bond Program Implementation

#### 2010 Bond Program Means Big Projects For the Richland Parks/Oaks Neighborhood

Since the May 8 election, City engineers and project managers have been putting together a work schedule for the \$66 million in improvements to take place across the city, and just recently a work schedule was approved by the Council that targets initiating or completing all of the projects in the program within the next three years.

Below is a listing of projects to come to the area with a preliminary status of each project:

Sidewalk Repair

Sidewalks that are eligible for repair must have a grade separation of 1 inch or more

Construction scheduled to start in 2013

Alley Rehabilitation 400 - 420 Tiffany Trail South alley, from Abrams to tee intersection Design scheduled to start in 2013

The 2010 Bond Program was made possible through a city election where voters approved the sale of \$66 million in bonds to fund a series of infrastructure, revitalization and other projects needed in the community. The City Council supported asking voters for approval based on historically low interest rates and low construction costs being noticed due to the down economy, and expects to save millions based on those factors combined with the City's AAA bond rating. Moody's and Standard and Poor's have both recognized Richardson with their highest ratings which allowed the City to attain an interest rate of 3.8% on the bonds sold for the proposed projects late last month.

The City is currently working on a Project Tracker website for the 2010 Bond Program and hopes to have it online in October. More information on the 2010 Bond Program is available at <u>www.cor.net</u>.

## **RHA Sidewalks**

The City is working through our bond program using a "worst first" strategy. There were 11 regions funded in the sidewalk program. The regions were rated based on the number and severity of trip hazards. The Richland Park\Oaks area was ranked 10 out of 11 regions.

The good news is Richland Park\Oaks was included in the bond program for sidewalk repair, City of Richardson anticipate beginning work during the third year of bond program implementation.

I know our staff will work through the sidewalk regions as quickly as possible.

#### City ordinances include dogs\cats

Owning a dog or cat can bring great joy, but also comes with responsibilities, both to the animals and to the community. The Richardson City Code includes ordinances instructing residents to pick up after their dogs or cats. Many Richardson city parks have "pooper scooper" bag dispensers; doubled newspaper delivery bags or empty bread bags also work well as pooper scooper mitts.

Additionally, in order to protect the community and to help ensure the safety of the animals, the ordinance requires that a dog\cat must be confined behind a fence, in a building or on a leash at all times. It is indeed unlawful for any one to allow their animals to run at large within the city limits or to run free in City Parks.

"Generally, people understand the reasoning of the rules and do the right thing with their dogs\cats," said Richardson Director of Health Bill Alsup. "Most people pick up after their dogs\cats and they make an effort to confine and leash their dogs\cats. Sometimes a small percentage of the community become complacent or are unaware or the issues and need a reminder"

## **RICHLAND ELEMENTARY NEWS**

Richland Elementary is our neighborhood school with a diverse enrollment of about 600 students, ranging from Pre-K – 6<sup>th</sup> grade. We are an Exemplary rated school with high expectations for our students. Activities include Robotics, Web Team, Lone Star Academic Challenge (placed 9th at the state level this spring), Student Council, Rhythm Rockets, Choir, Band/ Orchestra, Safety Patrol, and our Life Skills Program. Our principal is Greg Gaston and assistant principal is Misty Wilson. We have a growing PTA with many opportunities for volunteers. Anyone residing in our neighborhood may join the Richland Elementary PTA as a community member; annual dues are \$6 and you can sign-up in the school office at 550 Park Bend Drive. This year the PTA hopes to improve the grounds of the school by landscaping the area near the kindergarten rooms and putting in a walkway to connect the front drive and west parking lot. We will also be starting an ESL class for parents of Richland students, taught by neighborhood volunteers!

Please consider helping the school by enrolling in the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Program. All it takes is one easy step! Take this newsletter to Kroger the next time you shop there and upon checkout have the cashier scan the barcode below along with your Kroger Plus Card. Once a card is scanned with the barcode your Kroger Plus Card will be linked to the Richland Elementary account for the remainder of the school year. Every time you shop at Kroger and use your Kroger Plus Card, Kroger will contribute a percentage of your eligible purchases to the program which will earn money for our school. Last year we received over \$700 from this program and our goal this year is \$1,000!



#### There are several other ways you can help support your neighborhood school:

**1. Recycle paper and cardboard:** All paper and cardboard to be recycled can be taken to the recycling dumpsters in the east parking lot at the school. The school gets paid for the paper which is collected in the dumpsters. Remember to flatten out any boxes before depositing them in the dumpsters. Thanks!

**2. Clip and collect Box Tops and Labels** For Education from participating products and save juice pouches and small chip bags for our recycling program. You can drop these items off at the school office or schedule a pick up from your home by calling Cassie McCampbell at 972-235-1166.
